Dave Dixon, National NEMO Network Coordinator and Amanda Ryan, Municipal Stormwater Educator for CT Nonpoint Education for Municipal Officials (NEMO) will provide an update on the Connecticut updated Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) regulations and their efforts to help municipalities included under the updated regulations to comply with them. They have created a new on-line tool kit which will be demonstrated. This is a follow-up to a presentation given by Chris Stone of CT DEEP at our spring 2015 meeting, where an early draft of the updated MS4 regulations was presented to our group. The MS4 regulations were afterward amended to include fewer rural municipalities but expanded to include the Thames River watershed towns of Brooklyn, Killingly, Mansfield, Plainfield, Sprague and Willington.
