

Development Projects

TLGV periodically receives requests for comments on projects that may affect the National Heritage Corridor's natural, historic, or cultural resources. TLGV may, in its discretion, provide comments to federal or state agencies in the following instances:

A. A federal entity is conducting, funding, or permitting activities that directly affect the Corridor. TLGV may request consultation with the federal entity to minimize any adverse effect on the Corridor (Public Law 103-449, Section 107).

B. A state entity is conducting, funding, or permitting activities that directly affect the Corridor. TLGV may request the state entity to take the resources of the National Heritage Corridor into consideration in its planning documents and processes (CT Public Act 09-221; MA Chapter 272 of the Acts of 2010).

TLGV does not have the capacity to comment on projects that are conducted, permitted, or funded at the local level absent any state or federal activity.

TLGV does not have the capacity to appear at public meetings or public hearings but may submit written comments within an established public comment period. All requests for TLGV comments should be submitted to TLGV at least two weeks before the public comment period closes.

TLGV staff will draft comment letters for approval by the TLGV Board of Directors.
