




DEDICATION & TEAM WALKTOBER

The Hermonot Family and Ekonk Hill Turkey Farm

Rick and Elena Hermonot have been showing us for years just how important – and entertaining – local agriculture can be at their Ekonk Hill Turkey Farm in Sterling, CT. This 34th Annual Walktober is dedicated to them and their children as we name them Team Walktober. Sadly, the National Heritage Corridor lost one of its most vocal and passionate champions when Rick passed away in February. He was an active and energetic member of the TLGV Board of

Directors from 2008-2018, ensuring that local agriculture was always a top priority in the National Heritage Corridor.

Rick and Elena have always led by example and their children, Chris, Jon, Ashley and Katie have followed in their footsteps. When Rick and Elena transitioned from dairy farming to poultry in the 1990s, they did so with the idea of selling what their farm produced directly to consumers. No middle person. And if people were coming right to the farm, they might



actually want to stay for a little while. In the late 1990s the Hermonot's Ekonk Hill Turkey Farm was on the forefront of agri-tourism and well on its way to being the largest grower of pasture raised turkeys in Connecticut.

From the GIANT corn maze to homemade ice cream and a menagerie of crazy looking cluckers in the front yard of the farm store, the Hermonots have made their farm a welcoming and educational place where you can also buy fresh food and locally crafted products year-round.

The Hermonots have been hosting Walktober events since its early days as Walking Weekend.
